The enclosed documents represent the 10th release of information for Civil Action No. 19-cv-1465. This is in response to Parts 1 and 3 of your FOIA request.

Twenty three digital video discs (DVDs) were reviewed under the FOIPA, Title 5, United States Code, Sections 552/522a. Deletions have been made to protect information which is exempt from disclosure in its entirety pursuant to 552 (b)(6), (b)(7)(C), and (b)(7)(E). The exemptions used are explained on the enclosed Explanation of Exemptions.

You were previously advised that we were consulting with another agency concerning information located as a result of your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request. The consultation is complete and the enclosed material consisting of 38 reviewed pages and 9 pages are being released to you with the appropriate exemption noted next to the redacted information. The appropriate redactions were made by the Drug Enforcement Agency and the Department of Homeland Security.

This month's release exceeds the standard 500 page processing rate because the FBI miscalculated the amount of pages remaining in the system to be processed. Per the schedule we reported to the court, these additional pages were processed and are being included in this release.

This material is being provided to you at no charge.

FBI FOIPA Addendum

As referenced in our letter responding to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request, the FBI FOIPA Addendum provides information applicable to your request. Part 1 of the Addendum includes standard responses that apply to all requests. Part 2 includes standard responses that apply to requests for records about individuals to the extent your request seeks the listed information. Part 3 includes general information about FBI records, searches, and programs.

Part 1: The standard responses below apply to all requests:

- (i) 5 U.S.C. § 552(c). Congress excluded three categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIPA [5 U.S.C. § 552(c)]. FBI responses are limited to those records subject to the requirements of the FOIPA. Additional information about the FBI and the FOIPA can be found on the www.fbi.gov/foia website.
- (ii) Intelligence Records. To the extent your request seeks records of intelligence sources, methods, or activities, the FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), and as applicable to requests for records about individuals, PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(1), (b)(3), and (j)(2)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records is itself a classified fact protected by FOIA exemption (b)(1) and/or would reveal intelligence sources, methods, or activities protected by exemption (b)(3) [50 USC § 3024(i)(1)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that any such records do or do not exist.

- (i) Requests for Records about any Individual—Watch Lists. - (iii) **Requests for Records for Incarcerated Individuals.** The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records which could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any incarcerated individual pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(7)(E), (b)(7)(F), and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(7)(E), (b)(7)(F), and (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.

- (iii) Requests for Criminal History Records or Rap Sheets. The Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division provides Identity History Summary Checks often referred to as a criminal history record or rap sheet. These criminal history records are not the same as material in an investigative "FBI file." An Identity History Summary Check is a listing of information taken from fingerprint cards and documents submitted to the FBI in connection with arrests, federal employment, naturalization, or military service. - (iv) National Name Check Program (NNCP). The mission of NNCP is to analyze and report information in response to name check requests received from federal agencies, for the purpose of protecting the United States from foreign and domestic threats to national security. Dear Director Wray;

We write to express our deep concerns over the report from the Federal Bureau of Investigation entitled "Black Identity Extremists Likely Motivated to Target Law Enforcement Officers." This report could easily be read as applying a broad brush equating all political activists concerned with race-based issues as dangerous violent extremists. We believe that this report, and the classification of 'Black Identity Extremists,' will be used to unfairly target African Americans, activists or otherwise, by rank-and-file law enforcement as justification to use deadly force against Americans based on the color of their skin.

The FBI's decision to create a new designation of domestic terrorists, 'Black Identity Extremists,' by this report is overtly racist. This is just the latest in a series of attacks on African Americans by this administration. This decision is worsened by the FBI's well-documented history of using its investigatory powers to target and discredit African American activists and leaders, while ignoring non-African American activists or race-based sovereignty groups. This latest staggering move to classify legitimate race-based protest groups as broad probable threats to national security is steeped in racism, historical and current, and undermines the First Amendment rights of all Americans,

The right of citizens to peaceably assemble and redress their government is a fundamental right in America. The fact that some choose to do so to address racial injustices should not be a special reason for the FBI to raise alarms, nor should it earn a de facto "threat" label. All Oregonians value their freedom of speech and should feel safe when speaking out against injustice. Our government should not seek to classify groups of people as threats. While the instances mentioned in the report demonstrate horrible acts of violence, the report fails to establish any connection between those instances and current political and civil rights movements. In fact, it goes on to define a movement that exists in PBI terminology only.

At a time of increasing distrust in this country, the FBI and law enforcement should be working to strengthen their relationships with all communities throughout Oregon and nationwide. We are extremely concerned that the act of conflating activists with extremists based on the color of people's skin will exacerbate an already volatile political environment and could encourage the dangerous and unconstitutional targeting of American citizens by law enforcement.

Thank you for your attention to this important issue.

Dear Director Wray:

We are writing you to follow up on a letter we transmitted last year expressing consternation with the lack of adequate correspondence from the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) regarding its Black Identity Extremist (BIE) designation and our staunch opposition to its existence. Specifically, we have made numerous probing inquiries to gather the facts about this designation, its inception, its programmatic implications and the way in which it has been deployed thus far. However, we cannot overstate the insufficient nature of the Bureau's so-called responses. Change has arrived in the House of Representatives and you can expect there to be many questions for your Bureau about this designation, especially given the newly acquired tools at our disposal. The Members of the Congressional Black Caucus will continue to shine a light on the BIE designation in hopes of advancing swift termination of its use going forward.

When the American people overwhelmingly elected Democrats to retake the U.S. House of Representatives, they expected us to lead and advocate for meaningful reforms that impact their lives. Entrusted with this great opportunity comes great responsibility to effectively govern and conduct assiduous oversight of the Trump administration and its continued assaults on people of color. That is why we pledge to proactively engage in carrying out the review that you emptily promised to conduct at the highest levels of your agency. Additionally, as indicated in our last written correspondence to you, the recent case of Raken Balogun significantly heightens the urgency of our engagement and oversight.

Dear Attorney General Barr and Director Wray:

We are deeply concerned that the Department of Justice (DOJ) and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) are not taking adequate measures to combat white supremacist violence and instead are minimizing this growing domestic terrorism threat.

Last weekend, we witnessed another devastating incident of domestic terrorism. A 19-year-old man with an AR-15-style rifle allegedly yelled anti-Semitic slurs as he charged into the Chabad of Poway synagogue during a service celebrating the end of Passover. One worshipper was killed and three others were injured.

Unfortunately, this was not an isolated incident. In recent years, white supremacists have repeatedly targeted houses of worship, including the Sikh Temple of Wisconsin in Oak Creek, Wisconsin; Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Charleston, South Carolina; and the Tree of Life Synagogue in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Indeed, violent white supremacists pose a global threat, as demonstrated by the horrific massacre of 50 Muslim worshippers at the Al Noor Mosque and Linwood Mosque in Christchurch, New Zealand.

It is clear that violent white supremacists are the most significant domestic terrorism threat facing our nation today. An unclassified May 2017 FBI-DHS joint intelligence bulletin found that "white supremacist extremism poses [a] persistent threat of lethal violence," and that white supremacists "were responsible for 49 homicides in 26 attacks from 2000 to 2016 ... more than any other domestic extremist movement". In February, U.S. Attorney for the Western District of Virginia Thomas Cullen wrote in a *New York Times* op-ed:

[W]hite supremacy and far-right extremism are among the greatest domestic-security threats facing the United States. Regrettably, over the past 25 years, law enforcement, at both the Federal and State levels, has been slow to respond. ...Killings committed by individuals and groups associated with far-right extremist groups have risen significantly.

Last week, DOJ and the FBI finally briefed Senate Judiciary Committee staff on the domestic terrorism threat, nearly six months after the briefing was requested. The briefing reinforced our concerns that

the Trump Administration is not taking this threat as seriously as it should be. At this briefing, DOJ and FBI officials made a stunning admission: the Trump Administration has shifted its approach to tracking domestic terrorism incidents to obfuscate the white supremacist threat.

For the past decade, the FBI used 11 different categories for domestic terrorism, including a separate category for white supremacist incidents. The Administration is now using a classification system with only four categories, including "racially-motivated violent extremism." This new category inappropriately combines incidents involving white supremacists and so-called "Black identity extremists," a fabricated term based on a faulty assessment of a small number of isolated incidents, which, according to the National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives, "resurrects the historically negative legacy of African American civil rights leaders who were unconstitutionally targeted and attacked by federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies for seeking full U.S. citizenship under the law."

Given the large number of white supremacist attacks, we are deeply concerned that this reclassification downplays the significance of the white supremacist threat. The inherent problem with this approach was demonstrated by the fact that the briefers provided statistics on racially motivated violent extremism (since 2000, 62 percent of violent domestic terrorism incidents and 70 percent of fatal domestic terrorism incidents), but could not say how many involved white supremacist violence, other than to acknowledge they were "a majority" of the incidents. If we do not understand the scope of the problem, we cannot effectively address it.

We recently reintroduced a bill called the Domestic Terrorism Prevention Act. This bill – the only legislation pending in Congress to address this threat – would enhance the federal government's efforts to prevent domestic terrorism by requiring federal law enforcement agencies to take a number of concrete steps, including:

- regularly assessing domestic terrorism threats in an annual report;
- focusing their limited resources on the most significant domestic terrorism threats; and
- providing training and resources to assist state, local, and tribal law enforcement in addressing these threats.

Prior to his confirmation, Senator Durbin asked Mr. Barr to commit to review the Domestic Terrorism Prevention Act and provide his feedback. He responded dismissively: "I am not familiar with the details of the legislation. If confirmed, I can commit to working with Committee regarding legislation that supports the Department's mission and priorities."

Given the urgency of this issue, please respond to the following questions as soon as possible and no later than May 23:

1.

- a. What specific steps, if any, have you ordered DOJ and the FBI to take to respond to the threat of white supremacist violence?
- b. How are DOJ and the FBI currently allocating counterterrorism resources to address this threat?
- 2.
- a. How do you justify the change in tracking domestic terrorism incidents?

- b. Will you rescind this change and return to the long-standing practice of tracking white supremacist violence as a separate category of domestic terrorism incidents?
- 3. Will you take this opportunity to endorse the Domestic Terrorism Prevention Act?
- 4. After the New Zealand mosque massacre, President Trump was asked whether he thought white nationalism was a growing threat. He responded: "I don't, really ... I think it's a small group of people that have very, very serious problems, I guess." Do you agree with the President's remarks?

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- 4. According to data experts, the new annual crime report from the FBI—the Uniform Crime Report—is missing around 70% of the usual data tables that have been traditionally previously publicly reported by the FBI. In fact, data experts have called this development "unnecessary and surprising," and have expressed alarm that the missing data will hamper the ability of researchers and public policy experts to study and address key criminal justice issues, particularly drug and crime arrests.
 - a. Why did the FBI choose to remove this crucial data from public disclosure this year? At whose direction?
 - b. Why has the FBI chosen to be substantially less transparent on something as innocuous and crucial as crime data? Was this change directed by political personnel or appointees?
 - c. Have you or your staff spoken with criminologists who rely on this data about how this impacts their ability to review and assess crime policy?

Black Identity Extremists Designation

5. On October 6, 2017, Foreign Policy published an article disclosing the existence of an FBI Intelligence Assessment titled "Black Identity Extremists Likely Motivated to Target Law Enforcement Officers" (the "Assessment").¹ News outlets report that the term "Black Identity Extremists" appears to be "entirely new," and suggest that the FBI has created the term to justify surveillance of and other government action against Black people.² The FBI has historically used other terms to group unconnected Black people together (i.e., the use of COINTELPRO to surveil prominent civil rights activists in the 1960s). The Assessment itself notes that it builds from prior bulletins about "Black Separatist Extremists."

While largely the continuation of a trend, the term "Black Identity Extremists" is also distinguishable. The label appears to group together any individuals who have a sense of "Black identity" or, in the FBI's words, "perceive racism and injustice in American society."

- a. Has this threat assessment been revoked or is it still being relied upon?
- b. Has this designation been used to justify any law enforcement activity, including opening an assessment or investigation?
- c. Is an individual's race or ethnicity a factor in whether they are designated a "Black Identify Extremist" and ultimately targeted by the FBI for surveillance and other actions?" If race and ethnicity are not factors, please explain how the FBI arrived at the term.

- d. Does an individual's affiliation with the "Black Lives Matter" movement or political views regarding police brutality impact the FBI's assessment as to whether that individual could be a "Black Identity Extremist"?
- e. Have unrelated activists been grouped together under the umbrella term "Black Identity Extremist?"
- f. Please describe the analytic methodology used to conclude that threat exists based on the unrelated six incidents described in the report.
- g. Has this threat assessment been shared with state and local law enforcement officials or fusion centers?
- h. Which agencies have received this threat assessment? Have any agencies, upon receipt of this assessment, raised concerns.
- i. Does the creation of the term "Black Identity Extremist" mean that the FBI is now explicitly considering black activists a domestic terrorist threat? If so, is the FBI using this designation to allow surveillance and monitoring of these individuals under terrorism-related authorities?
- j. How does the FBI prevent its broad authority to conduct assessments from being used to monitor activists and communities of color, as occurred in the past under the COINTELPRO program?
- k. How can Members of Congress be assured that the FBI will not be violating the constitutional rights of Americans—in particular, organizers and activists who are exercising their First Amendment rights?
- 6. There is a great deal of secrecy now surrounding the BIE designation. The little that the American public knows is due to two major sources: (1) the leaked BIE report, published by Foreign Policy in early October, (2) an Al-Jazeera story publicizing documents obtained through a lawsuit filed by the Center for Constitutional Rights and the Color of Change. Other organizations, including the ACLU and the Center for Media Justice (CMJ), have filed Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests to learn more about the use of BIE and similar terms, as well as to better understand the leaked FBI intelligence assessment. These FOIA requests are still pending with your agency.
 - a. Why have you not responded to these FOIA requests?
 - b. We understand that you have indicated that these requests which ask for documents identifying "Black Identity Extremist" ("BIE"), "Black Separatist Extremist" ("BSE"), "Black Nationalist" ("BN"), or "Black Separatist" ("BS") are not sufficiently narrow. It seems to me that is a very specific request. Given this, why have these documents still not been made available to the public?
 - c. I believe these are questions of great national importance. Can you provide the information requested in these FOIAs directly to this committee?

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- 7. The FBI has said it does not subject individuals to surveillance or investigation solely based on First Amendment-protected activity. Documents released under FOIA, though, suggest that law enforcement may use First Amendment-protected activity as a major or even primary justification for monitoring activists if it decides there is any connection—however remote—between activists' protected, nonviolent speech and isolated acts of violence by individuals unconnected to those activists (note that the six killings of law enforcement off cited in the Assessment were perpetrated by individuals who were not part of any group or ideological movement).
 - a. Does the FBI use an individuals' speech as a primary or significant justification to initial a law enforcement activity, including opening an assessment or investigation?
 - b. Have individuals been identified as "Black Identity Extremists" based on their speech?
 - c. What is your agency doing to combat the threat posed by white supremacists who commit violent acts, in light of the events that occurred in Charlottesville?
- 8. Many organizations have called for the withdrawal of the BIE designation. In particular NOBLE, the National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives, has issued a press release calling for the withdrawal of the Black Identity Extremist definition as baseless and overbroad.
 - a. In light of the public outcry, including from law enforcement, has the FBI reevaluated its stance on BIE and similar designations?
 - b. Is the designation and any other similar ones going to be withdrawn or modified?

On Cell-Site Simulators

- 9. In September 2015, the Justice Department released policy guidance on the use of cell-site simulators—portable military grade surveillance devices that collect cell phone identification and location information by mimicking cellphone towers. Cell-site simulators have the ability to compel affected mobile phones to reveal their location and users' registration information. In order to ensure that the DOJ uses cell-site simulators in a manner that is consistent with the law, the Department's guidance instructs law enforcement agencies to first obtain a search warrant based on probable cause before deploying the devices.
 - a. Is this policy still in effect?
 - b. As Director, are you continuing to require the FBI to obtain judicial approval based on a probable cause standard prior to using cell-site simulators?
 - c. If the policy changes in any way, do you pledge to update Congress immediately?
 - d. Are you requiring the FBI continue to follow the data retention and transparency provisions included in the DOJ's 2015 guidance?

Q. What are you doing to continue Mr. Comey's efforts to pursue diversity within the ranks of the FBI?

Black Identity Extremism

• From 1956-1971, the FBI administered the CoIntelPro program, a surveillance program that targeted, among others, prominent activists and African American leaders, including the late Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr., for protesting against civil rights injustices.

• The CoIntelPro program was eventually perceived as an encroachment of the rights enshrined in the First Amendment.

• On August 3, 2017, the FBI's Counterterrorism Division promulgated a report entitled "Black Identity Extremists Likely Motivated to Target Law Enforcement Officers?"

• Earlier this month, Attorney General Jeff Sessions indicated that he had not read the report and that he was only familiar with it.

Q. Have you read the report or are you familiar with the August 3rd Report?

• The August 3, 2017 FBI Extremism Report indicates that violence associated with identity groups declined began to rise recently, in 2014, following the shooting death of Michael Brown in Missouri.

• The August 3 Report suggests that since 2014, there have been 6 separate incidents of violence that the FBI attributes to the resurgence of black identity extremism.

Q. As far as you know, has there been any coordination, connection or cooperation among any of these six individuals involved in these incidents.

• At the conclusion of the August 3rd Report, in the section of the report marked "Outlook," it states that the

"BIE's perceptions of unjust treatment of African Americans and the perceived unchallenged illegitimate actions of law enforcement will inspire premeditated attacks against law enforcement over the next year. This may also lead to an increase of BIE group memberships, collaboration among BIE groups, or the appearance of additional violent lone offenders motivated by BIE rhetoric."

• The report is dated August 3, 2017, but covers the period from August 2014 to December 2016.

Q. Since December 2016 has there been an increase in BIE Group membership or collaboration among BIE groups, or the appearance of additional violent lone offenders motivated by BIE rhetoric, as feared by the report?

Q. Are you aware of any specific groups, that are active today, that have perpetrated the types of attacks described in the August 3rd Report?

Dear Acting Attorney General Whitaker, Secretary Nielsen, and Director Wray:

As you are no doubt aware, Members of the House Judiciary Committee have written repeatedly to the Trump Administration and Chairman Goodlatte¹ on matters related to domestic terrorism, countering violent extremism, domestic surveillance, and the unfair profiling of racial, religious, and ethnic minority groups. To date, we have received little or no substantive response to any of these communications.

According to the latest FBI reporting, hate crimes increased by 17 percent last year—and approximately three out of five of the more than 7,100 incidents appear to have been motivated by race or ethnicity.² The report also shows that hate crimes motivated by anti-Semitism rose by 27 percent. We have reason to believe that even these troubling numbers fail to capture the extent of the problem, as hate crimes remain vastly underreported by federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies across the United States.³

The warning signs have been with us for some time. In May 2017, a joint FBI-DHS intelligence bulletin warned of the growing threat of violence posed by white supremacists, Neo-Nazis, right-wing extremists, and other white nationalist groups.⁴ Between 2008 and 2016, plots and attacks by white nationalist groups in the United States outnumbered the threat from Islamic extremists two-to-one.⁵ White supremacist groups are also recruiting aggressively on college campuses.6 Since 2014, more than 100 people have been killed or injured by perpetrators influenced by "alt-right" propaganda-more than 60 in 2017 alone.⁷ Recently, the FBI categorized the increasingly well-known "Proud Boys to be an extremist group with ties to white nationalism."8 It is also encouraging to learn that the Administration is studying the problem and has created a central online hub for hate crime resources,⁹ but Congress remains largely in the dark as to any concrete steps you may have taken to monitor, track, and prevent this hate-based. homegrown violence. However, there appears to be a politically driven effort to diminish programs that empower communities to counter the influence of extremist ideology.¹⁰ Reports indicate the Administration cancelled grants for organizations that help de-radicalize white supremacists and for researchers who develop media campaigns aimed at diminishing the online influence of these groups.¹¹

Reporting also suggests that the Administration remains focused on targeting specific racial and ethnic minorities as the suspected main sources of domestic terrorism. A draft report by the Department of Homeland Security, leaked in early 2018, details a plan to track and surveil Sunni Muslims in the United States.¹² The FBI's August 2017 Intelligence Assessment—issued

shortly after nation-wide protests against police brutality—concluded that "Black Identity Extremism," defined in part by "perceptions of police brutality against African Americans," remains a threat to law enforcement.¹³ Shortly after the Dallas police shooting by a lone sniper, the FBI reportedly circulated emails stating there was "a threat of black supremacist extremists attempting to violently co-opt the upcoming DNC/RNC."¹⁴

These concerning trends in law enforcement play out against the backdrop of President Trump's rhetoric. He calls himself a nationalist.¹⁵ He falsely claims that "foreigners" are the primary sources of domestic terror.¹⁶ He famously claimed that there were "some very fine people on both sides" of the riot in Charlottesville—where a neo-Nazi demonstration ended in the death of one counter-protestor and two officers of the Virginia state police.¹⁷

In the next Congress, this Committee will likely examine the causes of racial and religious violence, assess the adequacy of federal hate crimes statutes, and scrutinize targeted domestic surveillance of specific groups. We need to work together to study the disturbingly increasing number of hate crimes, the growing threat of far right and right wing extremism, and the disparate treatment of minority communities in terrorism investigations. The horrific massacre at the Tree of Life Synagogue in Pittsburgh, the murder of an African-American couple in a Kentucky grocery store and Indian engineers in a Kansas bar, and the package bombs sent to Trump opposition figures are only the most recent reminders of the ever-present threat of extremism in our country.

To that end, I ask that you provide a complete response to the questions posed in each of the following letters sent to you by some or all of the Members of this Committee:

 A February 3, 2017 letter to Acting Attorney General Dana Boente from Ranking Member Conyers, Ranking Member Thompson, and Ranking Member Engel, requesting answers to reports that President Trump intended to overhaul the government Countering Violent Extremism program in a manner that would target and single out Muslim Americans.

- A February 22, 2017 letter to Attorney General Jeff Sessions, Secretary John Kelly, and FBI Director James Comey, led by Representative Stephanie Murphy and signed by 150 members, urging federal agencies to address threats to Jewish organizations.
- A June 7, 2017 letter from the Congressional Black Caucus to Attorney General Jeff Sessions and FBI Acting Director Andrew McCabe, calling for the dedication of additional resources to hate crime investigations and prosecutions.

I also ask for your assistance in securing responses to an August 2, 2018 letter to President Trump from Ranking Member Nadler and Representative Lofgren to President Trump, asking how and why he issued false statements concerning terrorism-related offenses when addressing the country before a joint session of Congress.

Finally, in light of recent events, I also ask that you respond to the following:

- With respect to the creation and dissemination of the "Black Identity Extremists" intelligence assessment, please provide a list of any groups that have been designated as BIE, as well as any documents supporting such designation. In addition, please provide any communications by Department personnel relating to "a threat of black supremacist extremists attempting to violently co-opt the upcoming DNC/RNC."¹⁸
- Have you disseminated any intelligence assessments—similar to the BIE assessment that identify specific minority groups as threats? If so, please provide us with copies of these assessments and any supporting documentation.
- 3. With respect to the creation and dissemination of a report titled *Demographic Profile of Perpetrators of Terrorist Attacks in the United States since September 2001 Attacks Reveals Screening and Vetting Implications*, please provide us with copies of any drafts of this report, any supporting evidence for this report, and a description of any actions taken or considered related to the conclusions set forth in the report.
- 4. Please describe any actions taken or considered by the Department of Justice or the Department of Homeland Security related to the recommendations set forth in the GAO report titled, Countering Violent Extremism: Actions Needed to Define Strategy and Assess Progress of Federal Efforts.
- 5. Please describe any actions taken or considered by the Department of Justice or the Department of Homeland Security concerning the scope of existing "Countering Violent Extremism" programs, including but not limited to efforts to re-label such programs as "Countering Islamic Extremism" or "Countering Radical Islamic Extremism."
