### AMENDED STANDING BAIL ORDER

Pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 17-6-1 et seq., and in accordance with O.C.G.A. §§ 17-12-2(6)(A), 17-4-26, and 17-4-62; and in conformity with the applicable Georgia Uniform Superior Court Rules, including Rule 26.1, regarding criminal procedure; and all other applicable rules and statutes governing criminal procedure in this State, including the Equal Protection and Due Process clauses of the Fourteenth Amendment and the Eighth Amendment's prohibition on excessive bail, the Court hereby issues the following Amended Standing Bail Order for the purpose of establishing a schedule for secured bail and making bond determinations for indigent persons and those who do not have the present ability to post the monetary bail set by the schedule.

### I. Establishment of a bond schedule.

Pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 17-6-1(f)(1) a schedule of bail for certain offenses is hereby readopted and re-affirmed by the written and established bail schedule attached as Exhibit "A." The provisions of said exhibit are hereby incorporated by reference into this Standing Bail Order, as if fully set forth herein.

The purpose of establishing a bail schedule is to permit the posting of bail without a delay associated with the Initial Appearance within the time prescribed by Georgia law for such an appearance. The use of such a schedule, as authorized by state law, "provides speedy and convenient release for those who have no difficulty in meeting its requirements." Pugh v. Rainwater, 572 F.2d 1053, 1057 (5th Cir. 1978). However, to ensure due process and equal protection of the law, the Court will give "meaningful consideration of other possible alternative[]" means of release to those who cannot meet the bail schedule. Id.

The bail schedule shall apply to the specific offenses shown on the schedule. Any party, defendant, accused, or other person required or permitted by law to give or post a bail bond as surety or security in a criminal matter may discharge this requirement by depositing cash in the amount of said bail. O.C.G.A. § 17-6-4(a).

### II. Determinations of Indigent Status and Initial Appearance.

In *Pugh v. Rainwater*, the former Fifth Circuit considered en banc whether, "in the case of indigents, equal protection standards require a presumption against money bail." 572 F.2d 1053, 1056 (5th Cir. 1978) (en banc). The court "accept[ed] the principle that imprisonment solely because of indigent status is invidious discrimination and not constitutionally permissible." *Id.* at 1056. It recognized that "[r]esolution of the problems concerning pretrial bail requires a delicate balancing of the vital interests of the state with those of the individual," as the State "has a compelling interest in assuring the presence at trial of persons charged with crime," while "individuals remain clothed with a presumption of innocence and with their constitutional guarantees intact." *Id.* As recently reaffirmed by the Eleventh Circuit in *Walker v. City of Calhoun*, 901 F.3d 1235, 1258 (11th Cir. 2018), the incarceration of those who cannot meet a master bond schedule's requirements, "without meaningful consideration of other possible

alternatives, infringes on both due process and equal protection requirements." (quoting *Pugh v. Rainwater*, 572 F.2d at 1057).

Thus, arrestees charged with a misdemeanor violation or a violation of a local ordinance who are otherwise eligible for release but are unable, because of their poverty or financial circumstances, to pay a secured or money bail in accordance with the bond schedule shall be timely released as determined by a judicial officer on either: (1) a reduced, affordable bond; (2) a reasonable unsecured bond; or (3) on their own recognizance in accordance with O.C.G.A. § 17-6-1(i), without paying the secured bail from the attached schedule and as set forth below.

If an arrestee is otherwise eligible for release but unable to pay the bail amount set forth in the bond schedule, the arresting officer(s), jail personnel or staff, or some other appropriately designated person shall, as soon as practicable after booking, provide the arrestee with an affidavit to be completed in order to evaluate an arrestee's ability to pay a secured or money bail bond. The sworn affidavit shall give the arrestee sufficient opportunity to swear to his or her financial conditions, by providing information such as the arrestee's income and expenses, the value of any assets that the arrestee has, as well as those jointly held, to include money in bank accounts, real estate, and other property. The affidavit shall also give the arrestee the opportunity to provide the amount of any liabilities that the arrestee may have, such as loans, liens, or other financial obligations or recurring expenses. The affidavit shall also give the arrestee an opportunity to swear as to the amount of financial security or funds that the arrestee would be able to post or pay up front, including with contributions from family and friends. Finally, the affidavit shall give the arrestee the opportunity to provide information to make a determination if he or she is indigent, meaning that he or she earns less than 100 percent of the applicable federal poverty guidelines. See O.C.G.A. § 17-12-2(6)(A). For purposes of this Order, one-hundred percent (100%) of the federal poverty guidelines shall specifically mean the annual guidelines published in the Federal Register, and as may be further promulgated and adopted for subsequent years in the Federal Register, for the forty-eight contiguous States and the District of Columbia. The poverty guidelines as of the time of this Order are attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and can be found at: https://www.govinfo.gov/content/pkg/FR-2019-02-01/pdf/2019-00621.pdf. The judicial officer shall consider all of the above information from the affidavit—income, assets, expenses, debts, and whether the arrestee falls below the federal poverty guidelines—in making an individualized bail determination.

If an arrestee otherwise eligible for immediate release chooses to complete the sworn affidavit, it shall be presented to an impartial judicial officer at or before the time of the Initial Appearance. At a minimum, the Initial Appearance hearings providing bond determinations for arrestees otherwise eligible for release shall take place at least four days a week, and no more than 48 hours apart. Specifically, for purposes of evaluating such an arrestee's present ability to post the monetary bail set by the bond schedule, such arrestees shall be entitled to appear at the next-available scheduled initial appearance hearing after booking and processing are complete.<sup>1</sup>

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> All reasonable efforts shall be made to ensure that an arrestee is heard at the next-scheduled Initial Appearance hearing following the arrestee's arrest. However, it is understood that Initial Appearance

The Initial Appearance shall typically occur within forty-eight (48) hours from arrest. In the unlikely event that no hearing can be held within the time frame stated above, then the arrestee shall be released on a recognizance bond in accordance with O.C.G.A. § 17-6-1(i). In addition, arrestees who are arrested and/or held without a warrant shall be released after 48 hours of warrantless detention, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 17-4-62, if no warrant is obtained within that timeframe.

If it appears, as determined by the judicial officer, from the information provided in the sworn affidavit and any additional information provided at the Initial Appearance, that the arrestee does not have the present ability to pay a given monetary bail bond due to financial circumstances, the arrestee shall be subject to release: (1) on his or her own recognizance without making a secured bail in accordance with O.C.G.A. § 17-6-1 (i); (2) on a reduced, affordable secured bond; or (3) on a reasonable unsecured bond. Any arrestee otherwise eligible for release who remains incarcerated after the Initial Appearance shall be entitled to bring a motion for reconsideration of bail. If an arrestee otherwise eligible for release files a motion for reconsideration to challenge a bail decision, the arrestee shall be entitled to a rehearing of the bail decision within forty-eight hours or at the next-available scheduled Initial Appearance after the court receives notice of the motion, whichever occurs earliest, so long as the magistrate court retains jurisdiction.

Nothing in this Order prohibits the short-term detention of an arrestee who is presently intoxicated or under the influence of drugs, or the detention of an arrestee who poses an imminent danger to himself or herself or others, such that said arrestee would not otherwise be eligible for release, as determined by law enforcement. In addition, it is permissible to detain arrestees who are subject to holds preventing their release or arrestees who are subject to detention without bail under state or federal law. However, once an arrestee charged with a misdemeanor violation or a violation of a local ordinance, who was subject to a separate basis for detention, becomes eligible for immediate release, they shall be afforded the procedures set forth above to determine ability to pay the scheduled bond amount. Further, nothing in this Order shall prohibit the application of the bail schedule set forth in the Standard Bail Order to arrestees who are financially able to post bond in accordance with that schedule.

In such a circumstance, the arrestee shall appear and be heard at the next-available Initial Appearance hearing.
